Landmark for circular innovation: Circl dismantling to commence

Amsterdam, 30 April 2024 – Today, Icon Real Estate ("Icon"), part of Victory Group ("Victory"), announces the start of the planned dismantling of the Circl pavilion on Gustav Mahlerplein in Amsterdam. Lcp circulair ("Icp"), a joint venture between Dutch real estate redeveloper cepezedprojects and circular dismantling expert, Lagemaat, will act as the dismantling contractor. The dismantling is expected to take approximately nine months.

In practical terms, the dismantling that will take place is a ground-breaking piece of innovation that has never before been carried out by a commercial landlord in the Zuidas. Rather than taking the traditional approach of demolishing a building and send the materials to a landfill, our process sees the valuable materials being removed and carefully stored for a potential future use. Circular dismantling is, by definition, a time-consuming, difficult and expensive process that involves painstakingly removing components piece-by-piece. However, by doing so 1.2 million kg of CO2 emissions are stored in the materials and can be reused in a future project, thus avoiding the emissions of 1.2 million kgs of CO2 in that future project. This further contributes to a more sustainable built environment which is a mission Victory and Icon are prioritizing across their portfolio. The saving is the equivalent of charging a smart phone 79m times¹. Dismantling contractors also report this process is quieter, less dusty and less impactful for local residents than traditional demolition.

The Circl pavilion was built in 2017 by ABN AMRO with the intention of having a building that could be "re-circulated", i.e. disassembled and then reassembled elsewhere. Icon has taken up the challenge both in order to attempt to reuse as much of the materials, as well as to provide lessons for future development of circular construction. It is a means of prolonging the lifecycle of materials and should also serve as a demonstration of the innovative solutions – and the many hurdles – present in circular construction today.

The start of the dismantling in mid-May 2024 will mark a new phase for the Circl pavilion. Lcp, a market leader in the circular re-use of building materials in dismantling projects, has developed a novel dismantling method using virtual replicas of the building that needs to be dismantled. This 'digital twin' of the Circl pavilion allows for optimal planning by capturing its structure, materials, and components. All materials that come from the site get a 'material passport' which includes information about their origin, quality and value. By logging components and sorting materials into different categories up to 70% of the materials can be saved for re-use. Once the dismantling has been completed, it will be clear which materials have been harvested from the site, which will allow the components to be re-used in a future location, either as a whole or in their contingent parts.
